

GENERAL FAIR ENTRY RULES 2022

Fair entries are open to competitors of the world, except where otherwise stated and must be the work of the exhibitor.

ENTRY FORMS:

- To fill out an entry form complete the information at the top of the form including name, address including 911#, postal code & telephone number. If information is not complete prize money/cheques cannot be prepared.
- Select the Division you wish to enter and fill in on entry form.
- Select Class which applies to your article and fill this number in under Class number. (ONLY ONE ENTRY ALLOWED PER CLASS UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED).
- Add description of article when filling in description of article make certain you use the exact wording as listed in prize list.
- Sign Entry Form unless signed the form cannot be classed as an entry.
- Bring or send entry form to Fair Office before closing date.

Any article entered in competition must not have been entered in any previous year and entries will be received only for articles appearing in the Prize List.

FAIR OFFICE HOURS:

The Fair Office is open daily Monday to Friday during September from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM (Closed at 4:00 PM on Friday). Also open Sat. September 17 & 24, 2022 (9:00 AM to 5:00 PM) to receive entry forms.

CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRY FORMS:

For 2022 the closing date for submission of entry forms to the Fair Office is Saturday, September 24, 2022 at 5:00 PM

ENTRY TAGS:

Following receipt of the entry form entry tags are prepared. Exhibitors will find their entry tags ready for them at the Fair Office on the grounds. Exhibitors living at a distance, who want their entry tags mailed to them must enclose a \$3.00 fee for forwarding these tags. Entry forms must be received prior to September 16, 2022 to allow sufficient time to receive tags prior to the Fair.

EXHIBITOR FEES & ENTRY FEES:

Each Exhibitor must pay a \$5.00 (incl. HST) Exhibitor Fee. Exhibitor's Cards do not give admission to the grounds on Fair days but each competitive exhibitor upon payment of all fees will receive a one day pass to the Fair. The Exhibitor Fee entitles each exhibitor to make as many entries as he or she may desire.

NEW FOR 2022: ENTRY FEES WILL INCREASE TO \$2.00 PER CLASS TO MAX OF \$20.00.

IN ADDITION TO THE EXHIBITOR FEE an entry fee of \$2.00 PER CLASS to a maximum of \$20.00 in FIELD CROPS, GARDEN PRODUCTS, FRUIT AND HOMECRAFT DEPARTMENT (Homecraft Department includes Plants & Flowers, Culinary Arts, Honey, Quilts, Needlework & Crafts) LARGEST PUMPKIN ENTRY FEE is \$20.00 per class, LARGEST SQUASH is \$10.00 per class. PROFESSIONAL FLORISTS entry fee is \$5.00 per class to a maximum of \$10.00. THE OFFICE IS INSTRUCTED TO COLLECT ALL FEES WHEN ACCEPTING ENTRIES. FAILURE TO FORWARD YOUR ENTRY FEE WILL MEAN YOUR ENTRY IS NOT ACCEPTED UNTIL FEES ARE RECEIVED.

PLACEMENT OF ENTRIES:

In the General Department once entry form has been submitted to Fair Office, entry tags need to be picked up at the Fair Office prior to the placement of the entries. Articles are then taken to the following places:

Division 301 (Field Crops), Division 330 (Garden Products), 335 (Largest Pumpkin & Squash), 340 (Fruit), 425 (Honey) - **Grandstand**.

NEW LOCATION: Division 341 (Amateur Wines): Articles for competition will be accepted at Norfolk County Fair's Junior Farmers Building basement on Sunday, October 2, 2022 between 2:00 - 5:00 PM and Monday, October 3, 2022 between 8:00 AM - noon.

Division 401 (Plants & Flowers) - Grandstand.

Division 402 (Professional Florists) - **Grandstand**.

Divisions 420-424 (Sr. Culinary Arts), 430 (Quilts), 431-435 (Needlework), 439 (Retirement & Nursing Homes), 445 (Women's Institutes), 450-455 (Art), 460 (Crafts) - **Upper Homecraft Building**.

All entries are to be received at the appropriate location on Sunday October 2, 2022 between 2:00 PM and 5:00 PM or on Monday, October 3, 2020 between 8:00 AM and noon except class 421 & 423 which are received on Thursday, October 6, 2022 between 7:00 PM and 9:00 PM Entries in Division 422 may be picked up on Thursday, October 6, 2022 and if not picked up may be disposed of by the Society.

JUDGING:

Judging for the General Fair - will take place on Monday, October 3, 2022, except Divisions 421 & 423 which will take place on Friday, October 7, 2022.

PICKUP OF ENTRIES:

Any article entered for competition in the General Fair MUST REMAIN ON EXHIBIT UNTIL 10:00 AM on Tuesday, October 11, 2022 and may be picked up on Tuesday, October 11, 2022 between 10:00 AM and 1:00 PM and 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM ONLY.

2022: All participants that make entries from the General Prize Book & Photography Prize Book will have their prize winning cheque available for pick up Friday October 21, 2022. If cheques are not picked up they will be mailed out by October 31, 2022.

QUILTS DIVISION 430

All work must be solely of the exhibitor unless otherwise stated. No items in this division may be exhibited for more than 1 year. Soiled or used items will not be accepted. Heritage quilts exempt.

Hand Quilting

Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Annual Hand Quilted Championship Quilt

Rules:

- Please review the General Competition Rules document. 1.
- 2. The quilt must be solely made, and hand quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) fair to be eligible for this competition.
- 3. Quilts to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches. Note the quilt can be square, rectangular etc. All 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement.
- The quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back) 4. and not be mounted on a frame. The guilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt.
- 5. The winning OAAS Hand Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future OAAS fair, district and/or provincial competitions.
- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to give credit to the original 6. designer of the quilt pattern based on copyright rules.

Machine Quilting

Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Annual Machine-Quilted Championship Quilt

Rules: Apply to Classes 5-8

- 1. Please review the General Competition Rules document.
- The quilt must be solely made, and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) fair to be eligible for this competition.
- Quilts to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches. Note the quilt can be square, rectangular etc. All 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement.
- 4. The quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back) and not be mounted on a frame. The quilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt.
- The winning OAAS Machine Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future OAAS fair, district and/or provincial competitions.
- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to give credit to the original designer of the quilt pattern based on copyright rules.
- The use of domestic, mid arm and/or long arm equipment is permitted on hand or computer guided machine quilt entries.

16. Quilt, Exhibitor's choice Hand quilted by more than one person. Top to be pieced by one person 50% or more of hand quilting to be done by the exhibitor, no size

Machine quilting using Domestic sewing machine or mid arm, work solely of the exhibitor

- 17. Quilt, Exhibitors' Choice
- 18. Quilt, machine or hand appliqued
- 19. Quilt suitable for a twin or bunk bed
- 20. Wall Hanging, not to exceed 45" on any one side
- 21. Crib Quilt
- 22. Lap Quilt, up to 45" x 60"

Machine Quilting, long arm, not necessarily done by the exhibitor Top must be pieced by exhibitor On a separate card state name of quilter if not the exhibitor

25. Modern Quilting - With your choice of bold colours, prints, high contrast, minimalist design and expansive negative space. Finish with hand, big stitch or machine quilting

26. Art Quilt, any size, created to complete an original exploration of a concept or idea using textile manipulation, colour and texture in multiple layers held together with stitches or piercing of layers

27. Quilt Special

The exhibitor winning the largest number of points in the Quilt division shall be awarded the **"EDITH SIDWAY MEMORIAL AWARD"**. A cash award of \$60.00 will be given to the winner.

 1^{st} - 10 pts 2^{nd} - 7 pts 3^{rd} - 5 pts

Not to be won two years in succession by any one exhibitor
